- 1. Good parenting does not guarantee good children.
  - God the Father:
    - Adam and Eve
    - Israel
    - ... Israel is My son, even My firstborn ... (Ex. 4:22)
    - <sup>2</sup> Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O earth: for the LORD hath spoken, I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against me. (Isa. 1:2)

- 1. Good parenting does not guarantee good children.
  - God the <u>Father</u>:
    - Adam and Eve
    - Israel
    - Church
- 2. Children are <u>responsible</u> for how they <u>choose</u> to respond to the <u>influence</u> of their parents.
- 3. It is <u>regrettable</u> when parents experience <u>false guilt</u> .

- 4. Ezekiel argued against a <u>deterministic</u> <u>relationship</u> between parents and child:
  - A good parent can have a child who turns out <u>bad</u>
  - A <u>bad</u> parent can have a child who turns out <u>fine</u>

5. Some think "Parent-child relationship" is <u>irrelevant</u>:

Il Tim.3:1 This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.

Il Tim.3:2 For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,

a. it presents us with a perspective on the last days

- 3. The aged women ... teachers of good things;
- 4. That they may teach the young women ... to love their husbands, to love their children,
- 5. ...that the word of God be not blasphemed. (Tit. 2:3-5)

- 5. Some think "Parent-child relationship" is <u>irrelevant</u>:
  - a. it presents us with a <u>perspective</u> on the last days
  - b. Women will miss an <u>essential</u> ministry
- 6. Sign when society reaches its lowest point: break-up of family.

## I. His Connection (Proverbs 17:6)

Children's children are the crown of old men; and the glory of children are their fathers. (Prov. 17:6).

#### Crown —

- Meaning
  - Literally: crown of a king
  - Figuratively: something that is your <u>honour</u>
- Why crown?
  - ➤ Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord: and the fruit of the womb is his reward. (Ps. 127:3)
  - $\triangleright$ OT View: birth of child = <u>reward</u> and <u>blessing</u> from God.

## I. His Connection (Proverbs 17:6)

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#### Glory —

Something that you <u>love</u>, <u>delight in</u>, <u>boast about</u>; something that you <u>revel in</u>.

- The <u>child</u> revels in his <u>daddy!!</u>
- 2. <u>Psychological link</u> of child to father.

- spareth (withholds)
  - i.e. <u>refrain</u> from anything either knowingly or unknowingly.
  - Parents who, as a <u>habit of life</u>, holds back and fails to use his rod
- <mark>rod</mark>
  - Is symbolic for <u>authority</u>
  - ➤ Literal stick = a <u>club</u>
  - > = concept of <u>corporal</u> <u>punishment</u>

- hateth
  - used of those who <u>oppose</u> divine standards
  - Hate is <u>comparative</u>
- loveth
  - i.e. <u>recognition</u> of a person's worth; takes <u>action</u> to achieve the loved one's best.

- betimes (diligently)
  - means to be <u>black;</u>
  - the time just <u>before</u> <u>sunrise</u>
- Father who does not exercise corporal punishment and <u>authority</u> is guilty of <u>mental</u> sin = "hateth his son"
- Verse shows the complete contrast between <u>human</u> and <u>divine</u> viewpoints.

- What is chasteneth (disciplines)?
  - = the total process of training
  - 1. <u>Constructive</u> discipline = Process whereby children are <u>taught</u> God's Word in the home
  - 2. <u>Personal</u> discipline = Process of individual Christians <u>disciplining</u> themselves
  - 3. <u>Corrective</u> discipline = Process of <u>restoring</u> a child who has failed
  - 4. <u>Punitive</u> discipline = Process of training involving <u>penalty</u>

#### Why Discipline?

- 1. Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him. (Prov. 22:15)
- 2. <sup>13</sup>Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die. <sup>14</sup>Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell. (Prov. 23:13 –14)
- 3. The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame. (Prov. 29:15)

#### Why Discipline?

- Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying. (Prov. 19:18)
- 5. Correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul. (Prov. 29:17)

# "Secular" Training

#### Most parents:

- Huge emphasis on children's <u>education</u>:
- We all want to give our children the best start in life...

#### Higher priority:

- Offer children the knowledge of God
- Parents to make <u>spiritual</u> <u>training</u> a priority in raising children
- Some churches refuse to have Bible classes or Sunday School
- Believe it is responsibility of <u>home</u>, not <u>church</u>
- Church should not <u>usurp</u> that responsibility

- God placed responsibility of spiritual training on parents
  - 6. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:
  - And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.
  - 8. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes.
  - 9. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.

- Two obvious and indisputable truths:
- First:

Importance of parental involvement

- ➤ Children usually excel when...
- Father can be that critical difference in the lives of children

- Two obvious and indisputable truths:
- Second:

No child is prepared for life who hasn't been taught the <u>love</u> of Jesus Christ.


- Can raise children who have everything that the world uses to measure "success:"
- Children who live only for themselves and have <u>no concept of</u> relationship to God and others
- To live means to <u>relate</u>
  - Teach our children how to learn to <u>live</u> with others

- Mark 12:28 And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the first commandment of all?
- Which one is the most important?

- Mark 12:29 And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord:
  - ➤ Jesus replied with the <u>Shema:</u>
  - ➤ Recited twice a day by pious Jews
- Mark 12:30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. Mark 12:31 And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.
  - These two commands <u>summarize</u> all that God is saying to us
  - $\triangleright$  To live means to <u>relate</u> first to <u>God</u>, and then to <u>other people</u>

- "Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" from Leviticus 19:18
- "as thyself": not to justify advocating self-love BUT
- Acknowledgement that human beings do love themselves

- Regular attendance at church (corporate worship) very important
- Cannot imagine any parent not taking their child's attendance at worship just as seriously as they take attendance at school
- Father's attendance at worship important:



- Relationship with God summary:
  - ➤ Love Him whole-heartedly
- We need a relationship with <u>Christ</u>.
  We also need relationship with <u>Christians</u>.

- How do we relate to the world?
  - > Col. 4:5 Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time.
  - ➤ Col. 4:6 Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.
  - We are to remain <u>humble</u>, <u>loving</u>, <u>caring</u>, <u>kind</u>, and <u>gentle</u>
- Relationship with non-Christians summary:
  - Must be <u>attractive</u> to them, <u>genuinely</u> love them

#### Conclusion

There are only three ways to teach a child:

- The first is by <u>example</u>.
- The second is by <u>example</u>.
- The third is by <u>example</u>.

## III. His Comportment (Proverbs 20:7)

The just man walketh in his integrity: his children are blessed after him. (Prov. 20:7).

Three requirements for a father who wants a happy child:

- Just man = <u>Justification</u>
  = saved
- 2. Walketh = continuous behaviour
- 3. In his integrity = <u>completeness</u>, <u>innocence</u>, <u>fullness</u>
  - = What he <u>lives</u> and <u>believes</u> coincides

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- Results on child:
  - "blessed" i.e. happy (emotional and spiritual stability)
  - fortunate, enviable
  - ➤ Used for people who have tremendous <u>privilege</u> (<sup>8</sup>Happy are thy men, happy are these thy servants, which stand continually before thee, and that hear thy wisdom; I Kings 10:8)
- What a father is spiritually affects what his children are emotionally.
