
Session 2: Teaching using HBLT (Hook, Book, Look, Took)


What are the four key components of learning experiences?



- A learning activity: a process of engaging the learner so as to achieve the learning aim planned by the teacher.
- Process of communication: intellect, emotion, volition (June Tan)
- Christian curriculum: all the Christ-centred learning experiences provided to and constructed by Christian learners.



A Learning Aim = a statement that describes the overall goal or purpose of a learning experience.



How to Plan Learning Activities for Christian curriculum?

 A recommended way to plan learning activities: HBLT

Five Lesson Aims:

1. Determining Factors - Objectives [provided to learner]

2. Focus at the head - **Information** [provided to and constructed by learner]

3. Focus at the heart - **Motivational** [provided to and constructed by learner]


4. Focus at the hands - Action / Service [provided to and constructed by learner]

5. Combination - HBLT (Hook, Book, Look Took)

Creator of HBLT: Lawrence O. Richards, "Creative Bible Teaching," Moody Press, 1976.

• Richards: "It's best to avoid thinking of these as mechanical steps. They are more like four parts of a continuous, systematic but exciting process. In class, the students probably won't even notice passage from one part of the process to another. No part is marked by routine; each is full of opportunity for spontaneity and interaction. Yet each of these parts in the process has its own – and essential – role" (p. 108).



HBLT (Hook, Book, Look, Took) HOOK. What's going on?

- Get the learner's attention.
- Prepare the learner to hear the word of God
- Guide him or her to anticipate the teaching or encouragement that is found in the lesson's Bible passage.




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Question: What does the classical Chinese character on the left mean? Type your response.

The Methods of Christ as Teacher


Although Jesus was unlearned in the science of educational instruction, He nevertheless possessed a vast repertoire of instructional methodologies.

- Field trips



HBLT (Hook, Book, Look, Took) LOOK. What's the relevance?

HBLT (Hook, Book, Look, Took)

HOOK. What's going on?

- · Get the learner's attention.
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BOOK. What's new?

- Focus on the contents to be learned.
- Make sure that the selected Bible passage or verses are clearly explained and understood by the learner.

LOOK. What's the relevance?

- · Relate the lesson to real life.
- Understand how the learners could and should live their lives based on the lessons learnt.

TOOK. What to do next?

- Each learner to decide what they will take away from the topic.
- Each learner to know how to apply the lessons in specific ways.
