- 4. Protection from Angel of death, as by shed blood of the lamb on door posts.

O.T. – 1500 times, 20 times concerning 2nd Coming

N.T. – one out of 25 verses deals with 2nd Coming

- D. His aim was to incarnate His Word.
 (Ps. 40:8) I delight to do Thy will, O My God: yea, <u>Thy</u> <u>law is within My heart</u>.
 - 12 yrs old
 "about My Father's business" (Luke 2:49)
 - 2. 30 yrs old "*to do the will*" (John 4:34; 17:4)
 - 3. 33 yrs old

"not as I will" (Matt. 26:39; Heb. 12:2-4)

- E. We can trust and be assured of His will. Our desire – to know Him & make Him known
 - 1. Jesus' desire:

(John 6:29) This is the work of God, that ye believe on Him whom He hath sent.

2. <u>Paul's desire</u>:

(Phil. 3:10) That I may know Him, and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being made conformable unto His death

 - 3. <u>Passion</u>:

(Phil. 3:14) I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

(Phil. 1:21) For me to live is Christ and to die is gain.

FORSAKEN – SUFFERING IN SPIRIT

(Ps. 22:1) <To the chief Musician upon <u>Aijeleth Shahar</u>, A Psalm of David.>

My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?

- A. Shahar
 - musical term, of sprightly moves
- B. Aijeleth
 - hind of the morning
 - 1. Hind
 - symbol of innocent one, hounded to death
 - 2. Morning
 - joy bursting forth after affliction

- 1. <u>The language is abrupt</u>, without intimation of what would produce it.
 - **a**. It was done and He felt the effect.
 - **b**. In the N.T., He cried with a loud voice, showing the extremity of pain and great earnestness of spirit.

- 2. <u>The question "why?</u>" is a Hebrew expression, a more piercing one, in midst of intense suffering.
 - a. Never sorrow like this.
 - b. Formerly enjoying God's pleasure (Isa. 42:1; Matt. 3:17)

- 3. <u>Not an expression of impatience</u> and despair but of alienation and yearning
 - a. Faith and feeling of rejection, wrestling in His mind
 - **b**. Faith still claims God as "*My Elohim*".
 - c. Divine Name God's power, strength
 - d. Repetition shows depth of yearning and urgency.

- 4. Feeling of divine wrath, enshrouding Him
 - a. "<u>Why</u>?"
 - what is the cause?
 - **b**. "<u>Have Thou</u>"
 - Thou, My God of comfort
 - **c**. "<u>Forsaken</u>"
 - left me alone
 - **d**. "<u>*Me*</u>"
 - Your Only Begotten Son, pure and holy

FORSAKEN – SUFFERING IN SPIRIT

A. CRY OF AUGUISH

5. <u>A great gulf</u>:

"Why art Thou so far from helping Me, <u>and from the</u> <u>words of My roaring</u>?"

a. "*My roaring*" – human lamentation n strength.

b. Describing of intense suffering.

- 6. <u>New Testament</u>
 - <u>not how but that</u> it took place.

- 7. <u>How do these two truths agree</u>?
 - a. In one sense, God never forsakes any.
 - **b**. If there is so-called separation, there would be no more Trinity.
 - **c**. We do not know all that is involved.
 - **d**. The fact is that He became a curse for us.

B. Complaint of Astonishment

"O My God, I cry in the daytime, but Thou hearest not;

and in the *night* season, and am *not silent*." (Ps. 22:2)

- 1. "<u>My Elohim</u>"
 - Almighty, faithful and true
- 2. "<u>I cry</u>"
 - conviction that cries would still be in vain
- 3. "<u>Daytime ... night</u>"
 - incessant prayer
- 4. "Thou hearest not"
 - no favorable reply
- 5. "<u>No answer ... not silent</u>"
 - emotions intensified

FORSAKEN – SUFFERING IN SPIRIT

C. Contradiction of Assignment

1. <u>Reminder of God's character</u>

"<u>**But</u>** Thou art <u>holy</u>, O Thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel."</u>

- a. "<u>But</u>" clause of counter-argument
- **b**. "<u>Holy</u>" absolutely pure, set apart
 - 1) negatively, as separate
 - 2) positively, as pure, righteous
- c. God has shown Himself to His people.

C. Contradiction of Assignment

2. <u>Reminder of God's past care</u>

"Our fathers <u>trusted</u> in Thee: they <u>trusted</u>, and Thou didst deliver them. They <u>cried</u> unto Thee, and were delivered: they <u>trusted</u> in Thee, and were <u>not</u> <u>confounded</u>."

- a. God had helped in times past.
- **b**. *"Our fathers"* He descended from them
- **c**. Trust and rescue connected
 - 1) 3 times trusted, only once they cried.
 - 2) The One who cried day and night, unheard
 - 3) "*Not confounded*" not disappointed

C. Contradiction of Assignment

3. Witness of the New Testament

(Heb. 5:7-9) Who in the days of His flesh, when He had <u>offered up prayers and supplications with</u> <u>strong crying and tears</u> unto Him that was able to save Him from death, <u>and was heard in that He</u> <u>feared;</u>

Though He were Son, yet **learned He obedience by the things which He suffered**;

And being made perfect, He became <u>the Author of</u> <u>eternal salvation</u> unto all them that obey Him;

 - d. To physical comfort & security (Luke 9:57)
 - e. To make decisions (John 5:17-30)
 - f. To His own life obedient unto death (Phil. 2:8)

D. Lesson of saying No to self

- 1. One great Passion of Christ
 - Father's will
- 2. His yielded rights
 - "of no reputation"
- 3. Challenge
 - "I die daily" (1 Cor. 15:31)

(Gal. 2:20) I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

D. Lesson of saying No to self

- Dying to self
 (Gal. 2:20) I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I
 live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life
 which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the
 Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself for me.
- 2. Yield members:

(Rom. 6:13) ... yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God.

3. Be controlled:

(Eph. 5:18) And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit.

REJECTED AND DESPISED

(Psalm 22:6-11)

- But I am a worm, and no man; a reproach of men, and despised of the people.
- 7. All they that see Me laugh Me to scorn: they shoot out the lip, they shake the head, <u>saying</u>,
- 8. He trusted on the LORD <u>that He would deliver Him: let Him</u> <u>deliver Him, seeing He delighted in Him</u>.
- But Thou art He that took Me out of the womb: Thou didst make Me hope when I was upon My mother's breasts.
- 10. I was cast upon Thee from the womb: Thou <u>art My God</u> <u>from My mother's belly</u>.
- Be not far from Me; for trouble is near; for there is none to <u>help</u>.

A. The Reproach

- 1. "A worm"
 - degradation, contempt, helplessness
- 2. "No man"
 - ceasing from man, rejected
- 3. "Laugh me to scorn"
 - mock with contempt
- 4. "Shoot out the lip"
 - burst open the mouth
- 5. "Shake the head"
 - partly of contempt, abhorrence
- 6. "Roll himself"
 - ironical counsel and scorn

SUFFERING IN SELF-ESTEEM

- **B.** The Request argument for deliverance
 - 1. "Took me out of the womb"
 - loving relationships
 - 2. "Make me hope"
 - lie securely
 - 3. "None to help"
 - none, except God alone
 - HE is sufficient!

SUFFERING IN SELF-ESTEEM

C. The Rejection

- 1. Of His birth
- 2. Of His home folks
- 3. Of His family
- 4. Of His ministry
- 5. Of His disciples
- 6. Of His friends and enemies
- 7. Of the Father on the Cross

D. The Challenge

(Mark 10:38) But Jesus said unto them, Ye know not what ye ask: can ye drink of the cup that I drink of? and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?

(Isa. 53:7) He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.

D. The Challenge

(1 Pet. 2:21) For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:

(Heb. 13:12) Wherefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate.

(Heb. 13:13) Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach.

(2 Tim. 2:12) If we suffer, we shall also reign with <u>him: if</u> we deny him, he also will deny us:

E. Redemptive Purposes

- 1. To make useful in saving others
- 2. To forge bond of divine-human suffering
- 3. To identify and comfort others.
- 4. To enter deeper into faith and obedience
- 5. Ultimately, to become like God

The work of obedience is the evidence that the nature of God is in us.

"<u>It is finished</u>!" "Tetelestai" – <u>perfect tense</u>

- **A. Accomplished** work He came to do Mission done.
 - 1. Came to save sinners (Luke 19:10)
 - 2. Redeemed them under the Law (Gal. 4:4,5)
 - 3. Took away sins (1 John 3:5)

(1 John 3:5) And <u>ye know that He was manifested to</u> <u>take away our sins; and in Him is no sin</u>.

"<u>It is finished</u>!" "Tetelestai" – <u>perfect tense</u>

- **B.** Performed utmost requirements of Law
 - 1. Not only kept the Law (Rom. 7:12)
 - 2. Suffered its penalty and endured the curse

(Gal. 3:13) Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree:

"<u>It is finished</u>!" "Tetelestai" – <u>perfect tense</u>

C. Made an end of

- 1. Paid for our sins and guilt (Eph. 1:7)
- 2. Sins transferred, laid upon Jesus (1 Pet. 2:24)
- 3. The Cross is the grave of our sins.

(1 Pet. 2:24) Who <u>His own self bare our sins in His</u> <u>own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins,</u> <u>should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye</u> <u>were healed</u>.

"<u>It is finished</u>!" "Tetelestai" – <u>perfect tense</u>

- **D.** Destruction of Satan's power
 - 1. Defeated foe (Heb. 2:14; Col. 2:15)
 - 2. No claim over us (1 John 3:8)
 - 3. Delivered from him and unto Jesus

(Col. 1:13) Who <u>hath delivered us from the power of</u> <u>darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom</u> <u>of His dear Son</u>:

RISEN, ALIVE AND COMING AGAIN

(Rom. 1:4) And <u>declared to be the Son of God</u> with power, according to the Spirit of holiness, by <u>the resurrection from</u> <u>the dead</u>:

(Heb. 7:25) Wherefore He is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, <u>seeing He ever</u> <u>liveth to make intercession for them</u>.

(John 14:19) ... *because I live, ye shall live also.*

RISEN, ALIVE AND COMING AGAIN

(Heb. 9:28) So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for Him <u>shall He appear</u> <u>the second time without sin unto salvation</u>.

(1 Thess. 4:16,17) For <u>the Lord Himself shall descend from</u> <u>heaven with a shout</u>, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:

Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to <u>meet the Lord in the</u> <u>air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord</u>.
